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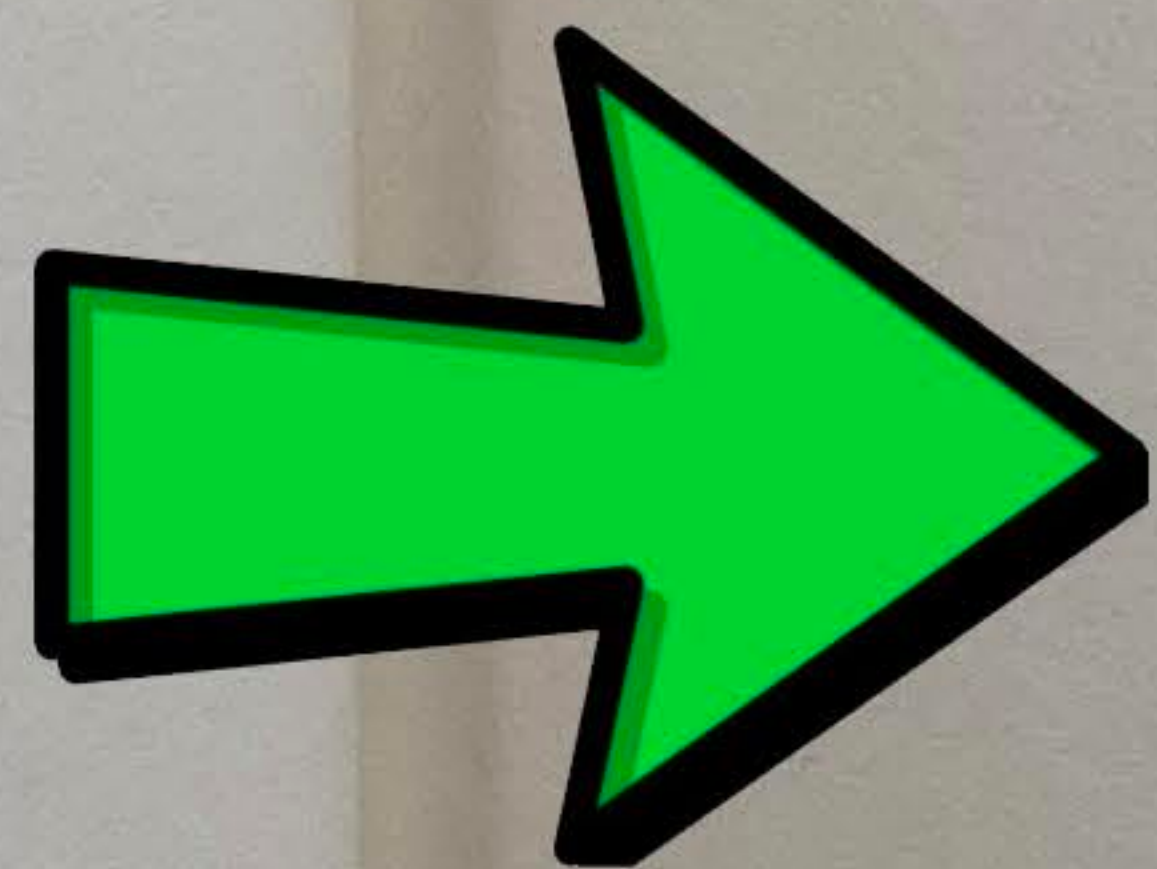

6. **HANNAH² WING** (*Owl*, JUN 1915, p. 1449) *Hanna wing the dather of Daniell wing borne the 28 July 1642* (Sandwich VRs, I:18 [orig. I:211]) *hannah Wing ye Daughter of Daniell and hannah Wing Was borne ye twenty-eight Day of ye fifth moneth in ye yeare one thousand six hundred forty & three 1643* (*ibid*, II:1243 [MM I:42]) She married **JEDEDIAH LOMBARD [LUMBER(T)]** [later also Lambert] (CCL, #54 I:857; and Truro - Cape Cod, p. 542) *Jedediah Lumber & Hannah Wing Married 20 May 1668* (MD 11:98 [Barnstable VRs, p. 431]) *Thos Lumbart Senr [and Joyce Colman?] his Children Born at Barnstable his Son Jedediah born ye 20 Sept 1640* (MD 11:97 [Barnstable VRs, p. 430]) *Thomas Lumbert senir; his son Jededia borne the 20th of September 16[worn]* (MD 18:201 [Plymouth Col. VRs, Barnstable, p. 49])

Jedediah was a fisherman. [He] is mentioned in one of a hundred recorded as owners of title and property in Barnstable in 1670. In 1710 he is recorded as among the first 19 men to own cattle in Truro. Truro was incorporated in 1709. In 1732 he is mentioned among the proprietors of Truro required to keep fences. The Lombards were in Barnstable among the very first in 1639 and were probably living in that part of town known as Metacheese. (*Owl*, JUN 1915, p. 1449) They never joined the Quaker faith.

Hannah Wing and Jedediah Lombard had: born Barnstable

7. **LYDIA² WING** (*Owl*, JUN 1915, pp. 1449-50; 1994, pp. 5071-73) *Leidia wing dafter of Daniell wing of sandwige borne the 23 of may 1647* (Sandwich VRs, I:18 [Book I:211]) *Lidia Wing the Daughter of Daniell & hannah Wing Was borne ye twenty eight of ye third moneth in ye yeare one thousand six hundred fourty & seaven 1647* (*ibid*, II:1243 [MM I:42]) She was still living on 11 6 mo [AUG] 1704 when she witnessed the marriage of Gershom Gifford to Deborah Bowerman. (Gifford-Barrows, p. 18) However, she was apparently dead in 1709 when the town granted to John Abbott ten acres of land adjacent to the site "where his dwelling house now stands," with no reference to a wife. (*Owl*, NOV 1994, p. 5071)

She married twice, first to **THOMAS HAMBLETON** who died before 1677. (*ibid*) Possibly Thomas was a brother of William Hamilton. According to the history of RI and the History of Danbury, CT books, this William killed the first whale and

because it was considered extremely bad luck at the time, was sent away from Cape Cod - thus moving to RI. (www.familyorigins.com/users/b/l/o/Peter-E-Blood/FAMO5-0001/d31.htm#P1131) William is said to have been born in MAY of 1647 in Glasgow, Scotland, the son of Galatin Hamilton. (*ibid*)

She married **JOHN ABBOTT**. John Abbott married Lydia (Wing) Hamilton... Her marriage to John Abbott took place between Sep 1683 when she was called Lidia Hambolton (Gifford-Barrows, p. 18) and early 1685 when as "Lidia Habbott" she became ill and the town paid for a doctor for her. (*Owl*, NOV 1994, p. 5071)

John Abbit [died] May 16 [John Abbott, an unknown person, married about 1687 Lydia (Wing) Hamilton. He was allotted ten acres of land for his lifetime, in a town meeting in 1709. The land was reallocated in 1714, which places his death in 1714 or very shortly before.] (Sandwich, *VRs*, I:29 [II:1]) Bowman (*MD* 29:23) indicated this death record immediately followed Elisha Bourne who d. Dec. 10th. In a note he stated that Elisha's gravestone had d. Dec. 10th, 1710. John Abbott, of Sandwich, Mass. has not been identified with any of the known Abbott families in New England. He had 13 acres of land on upper Shawme Pond, in Sandwich; 3 acres were granted in 1688 and 10 acres in 1706, adjacent to the property of Daniel Wing Jr. who was his brother-in-law. This property was called "Abbott's Orchard" granted to John only for his lifetime. (Gifford-Barrows, p. 18)

Charles E. Pope, one of the oldest residents of Sandwich, wrote *The Owl* in 1903, "The orchard eastward of the house of uncle Ebenezer's place was known in my boyhood as "Abbott's Orchard." "Uncle Ebenezer's place was generally accredited with being the homestead of the very first Wings at Sandwich. It is noticeable that Lydia is the only one of Daniel's daughters provided for in his will, and, although she is fifty-one years of age at the time, her father "constitutes and ordained to be over her John Jennings and Thomas Smith." (*Owl*, JUN 1915, pp. 1449-50)

[Lydia] returned to Sandwich about 1677 [after the death of her first husband] at age 30 with two small sons born in Rhode Island, and lived with these boys in a primitive hovel previously used by Indian women tending to summer crops on open planting fields. This was unheard of, and furthermore, the land had not been granted to her or to anyone. (This field where she settled is now the park around the Military Museum at Heritage Plantation of Sandwich). Her living here was a matter of deep embarrassment to her father and to the Quaker community, who gave her gifts of shoes, corn, wool and cash, and would have found her a proper house, but she refused to move. (Russell, *Sandwich*, p. v)

8. **SAMUEL² WING¹** (*Owl*, JUN 1915, p. 1450) *Samuell wing borne the 28 of august 1652 (Sandwich VRs, I:18 [Book I:211]) Samuell Wing the son of Daniell & hannah Wing Was bone ye twenty eight day of ye six moneth in ye yeare one thousand six hundred fifty & two 1652 (ibid, II:1243-4 [MM I:42]) He died in Sandwich before 29 SEP 1701. (Probate record, see below)*

He married there **MARY DILLINGHAM²** before 1676. (*Sinnott*, p. 215) *Mary Dillingham Daughtter of Henry Dillingham was borne 26th of Desember Ano Dom: 1654 Mary Dillingham ye Daughtter of Henry Dillingham was borne the 25 of Desember Ano 1653: (ibid, I:19 [Book 1:217]) Mary Dillingham ye Daughter of Henery & Hannah [Perry] Dillingham was borne ye 23 day of ye tenth moneth in ye yeare one thousand six hundred fifty & three 1653 (ibid, II:1240 [MM I:9]) She died after AUG 1702 when mentioned in her father's will.*

Samuel was a member of the Friend's Meeting at Spring Hill, and the births of his children are found there on record. (Owl, JUN 1915, p. 1450) He was admitted a townsman and took the oath of fidelity at Sandwich in 1681. (ibid.) Daniel ended up giving his property (both real and personal) to his children in 1658/9. It is likely that Samuel lived in his father's original homestead. He died intestate. Administration granted Sept. 29, 1701, to his widow, Mary Wing. Inventory shows real estate, £384; personal property, £166, 5s. (Owl, DEC 1904, p. 354 [Barn Pbt. 2:86, 203; 4:68])

Samuel Wing and Mary Dillingham had: born Sandwich

42. **HANNAH³ LOMBARD** (⁶Hannah² WING, Daniel¹) Daughter Hannah born August 1673 (MD 11:98 [Barnstable VRs, p. 431]) She married twice, first to **NATHANIEL BACON (II)**.¹ Nathaniel Bacon and Hannah Mayo.... Their Son Nathaniel Born 5th of February 1645 (MD 2:214 [ibid, p. 393]) The Above sd Nathaniel Bacon Senr Dyed ye Last of Decemr 1691 (MD 2:215 [ibid.]) His will 6 AUG 1691 was proved 20 APR 1692. Inventory taken 1 FEB 1691/2. (MD 16:58-9) All of Nathaniel's children were by his first wife.

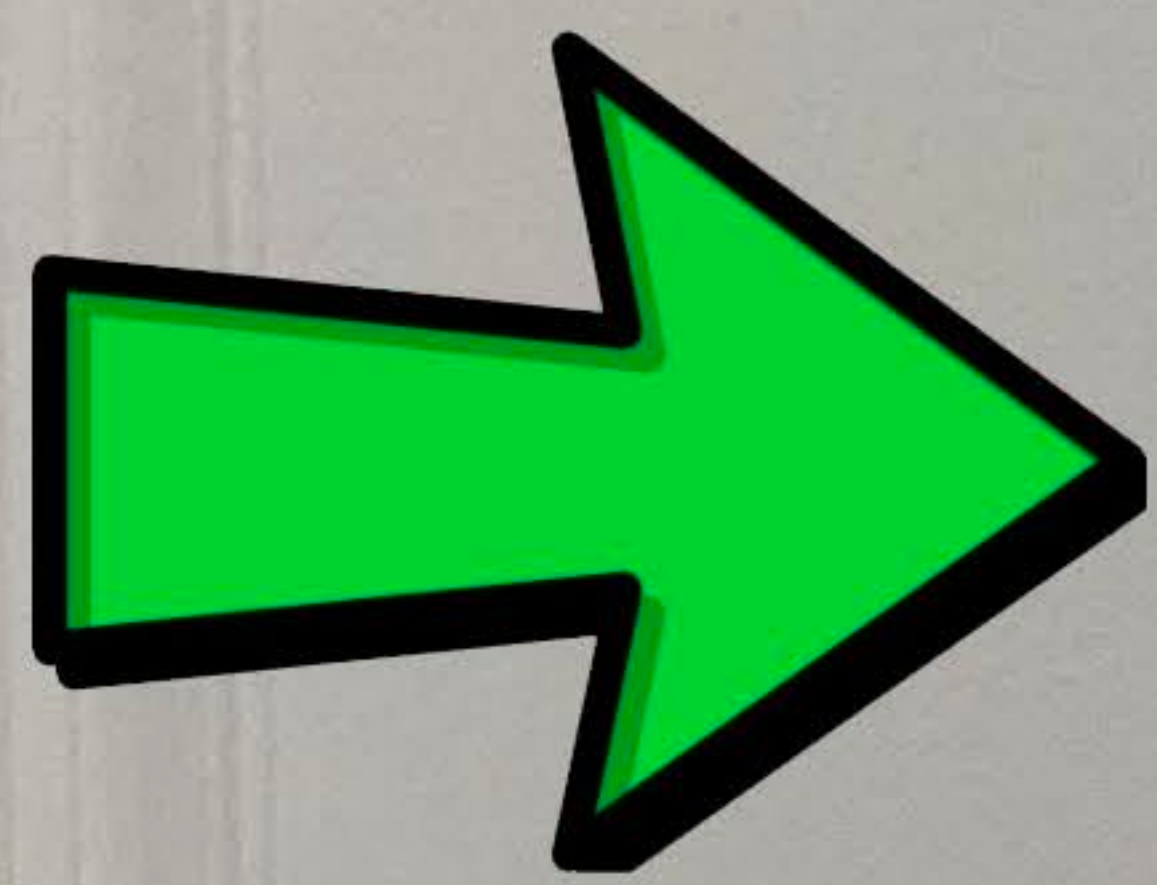
She married **JOHN DAVIS**.² John Davis Jur & ye Widdow Hannah Bacon Married [illegible] 1699 pr Mr Russel (MD 4:224 [Barnstable VRs, p. 409])³ his [John Davis and Hannah Lynnel] son John born About ye Midst January 1649 (ibid.) He is said to have been born 6 JAN 16[49/]50. (Savage, II:18) He died 13 JUL 1729. (Falmouth VRs, p. 230) John Davis, Jr., was a house carpenter... He removed to Falmouth about the year 1710, and died in 1729, aged 80, leaving an estate appraised at £1,810. He names his ten sons and two daughters, and his wife's daughter, Elizabeth Bacon,⁴ in his will... (Gen. Notes Barn., pp. 297-8)

43. **Sgt. DANIEL³ HAMBLETON [HAMILTON]** (⁷Lydia² WING, Daniel¹) (CCL, #36 I:582; H. Chatham, pp. 223-4) was born Newport, RI about 1669. (Gifford-Barrows, p. 18) [Hamilton] Daniel, died 8 December, 1738, in his 69th year. (MD 8:237 [Oldest burial ground in Chatham])

He married four times, first to **MARY SMITH** (MF5G 6[Hopkins]:91) Eastham, about 1693. (MD 12:112, 114, 116-117) *Mary Smith the Daughter of Samuel Smith* [and Mary Hopkins] *was borne the third Day of Jenuary : 1669[70] :* (MD 8:18 [Eastham & Orleans VRs, p. 77]) She descended from Stephen Hopkins of the Mayflower: Mary Hopkins, Giles Hopkins, Stephen. *By the will of her father who died in 1697, his wife came into possession of one-half of two farms at Monomoit located at Tom's Neck, and the family removed thither.* (CCL, #36 I:582)

He married **SARAH SMITH SNOW**.⁵ (D)aniel Hamilton and Sarah Snow were married by (Mr) Samuell Treat on the fifth day of august anno dom 1708 (MD 4:30 [Eastham & Orleans VRs, p. 15]) John Smith [wife Hannah Williams] *a daughter borne named Sarah the 27th day of March in the yeare 1671 ales 1672* (MD 4:33 [*ibid*, p. 21])

He married **DESIRE GORHAM SPRINGER**.⁶ Daniel Hambleton & Desire Springer Married by Col Gorham ye 15 Dec 1715 (MD 14:87 [Barnstable VRs, p. 384]) Their [James Gorham and Hannah Huckens] *Daughter Desire Gorham born ye 9 Day of Feb 1674[5]* (MD 5:72 [*ibid*, p. 414]) Desire descended from John Howland of the Mayflower: James Gorham, Desire Howland, John.

*His fourth wife, (after 1722) who survived him, was named ELIZABETH, perhaps daughter of John Taylor.*⁷ (H. Chatham, p. 224)

Serg. Hamilton, with his brother Thomas, served under Capt. John Gorham in the expedition to Canada in 1690 and received therefor a share of land at Dunbarton, N. H., in 1735. (CCL, #36 I:582) These sons [of Thomas] removed to Chatham in 1690. (Gifford-Barrows, p. 18) *His will, written by Rev. Mr. Lord, dated January 20, 1735-6, was proved March 22, 1738-9. In it he calls Sarah, Elizabeth and Thankful his three youngest daughters.* (H. Chatham, p. 224)

Daniel Hambleton and Mary Smith had:

44. **LYDIA³ ABBOTT** (¹Lydia² WING, Daniel¹) (Owl, 1986, p. 4655) was born Sandwich about 1687. (Gifford-Barrows, pp. 18-9) On 2 MAY 1754 Lydia Tabor, widow, gave receipt for her legacy from the estate of her husband, Joseph Tabor. (MFIP Cooke, #128 p. 103 from Bristol Pbt. 14:02) She married twice, first to **JONATHAN GIFFORD** (Gifford-Barrows, pp. 7-8) in Sandwich 3 AUG 1708. (NEHGR 129:33 citing Sandwich Friends Meeting Records⁸) Jonathan Gifford the son of William Gifford and of Mary [Mills] Gifford his wife was Born the 4th day of May Anno 1684 (Sandwich VRs., I:68 [II:33]) Jonathan Gifford Died February the 10th Anno Domini 1734/5 (*ibid*, I:36 [II:7]) The will of Jonathan Gifford, husbandman, of Sandwich, dated 15 September 1734, proved 21 February 1734/5, bequeathed to "wife Liddia"; to his two sons, Peleg and Silas; to his daughters Moriah, Rebecca, Bethiah, Hannah, and Anne. The sons were to share equally in housing, other buildings and all lands and meadows, but the widow was to have the use of all the real estate during her widowhood. Lydia was appointed sole executrix (Barnstable Probates, 5:212). (NEHGR 129:33)

She married **JOSEPH TABER⁹** (MFIP Cooke, #128 pp. 102-3) Joseph Taber of Dartmouth, yeoman, and Lydia Gifford Relict of Johathan Gifford of the Town of Sandwitch ... [were married] the 30th day of the 9th mo Called november in the year of our Lord 1738 (Sandwich VRs, II:1256 [MM I:142]) He was born 7 MAR 167[8?]/9, son of Thomas Taber and Mary Tomson. (Dartouth VRs, I:269) He descended from Francis Cooke of the Mayflower: Mary Tomson, Mary Cooke, Frances Cooke. His will was dated 20 DEC 1748 and proved 6 FEB 1753. (MFIP Cooke, #128)

214. **Lt. THOMAS⁴ HAMILTON** (⁴³Daniel³, Lydia² WING, Daniel¹) (H. Chatham, p. 285 Note 72) (MF5G 6 [Hopkins] 359-60) *Thomas Hammilton the Son of Daniel and Mary Hammilton was Borne the first day of September In the year 1695* (MD 8:246 [Eastham & Orleans, MA VRs, p. 90]) [Hamilton] Thomas, died 1 May, 1772, in his 77th year. (MD 8:237 [Old Burial Ground]) He married **REBECCA MAYO**. *Thomas Hambleton of chatham and Rebecca Mayo of Eastham were married by Nathaniel ffreeman Esqur on the third day of may 1716* (MD 15:57 [Eastham & Orleans VRs, p. 8]) *Rebecca Mayo the Daughter of Nathaniel and Mary [Snow]⁹ Mayo was Born att Eastham in the month of April in the year of our lord 1697* (MD 8:89 [Eastham & Orleans VRs, p. 79]) She was mentioned in her husband's will (dated 9 APR 1772) and descended from Stephen Hopkins of the Mayflower: Mary Snow, Joseph Snow, Constance Hopkins, Stephen Hopkins.

Thomas fought in the French and Indian War from Chatham. *Will of Thomas HAMILTON, gent. of Chatham MA. <Barnstable Co. PR> <17:18>...dated 9 Apr. 1772, mentions wf Rebecca; daus Lydia HAMILTON, Mary SAUNDERS, Rebecca SMITH, Jane SMITH, Zurviah SMITH & Dalilah COLEMAN; sons Thomas HAMILTON & Nathaniel HAMILTON... if dau Lydia should be incapable of labor my two sons shall bear their equal share of her support while they are able, so she shall not become a Town charge; both sons, executors. Witnesses: Thomas HAMILTON Jr., Richard SEARS, James NICKERSON. Pr. 12 May 1772 by Nathaniel HAMILTON & Thomas HAMILTON Jr., exrs. <17:20> Inventory taken 2 June 1772 by Paul SEARS, Thomas HAMILTON, Richard SEARS; incl. meadow at Great Beach £24; meadow at Little Beach, £21; land north & east of barn, £140; half the dwelling house, £6; Benjamin BASSETT's time till he is 21, £5.6.8d. (Mayflower Deeds & Probates, p. 308 [Hopkins])*

He married second, Lydia's sister **222. THANKFUL HAMILTON** (CCL, #36, I:580)

(Mayo Gen, pp. 32-3; and *H. Chatham*, p. 248) *January y^e 27th 1721/2 Judah Mayo Signified his purpose to marry with Mary Hamilton of Chatham in order to be published (MD 28:112 [Eastham & Orleans VRs, p. 209]) Thomas Mayo [and Barbara Knowles] a sonne borne the 25 day of September 1691 Named Judah: (MD 8:94 [Eastham & Orleans VRs, p. 83a])*

He made a will Eastham 5 DEC 1758, proved 6 OCT 1761. (MD 40:82-3) It mentions son Judah (executor), wife Mary, grandson ?Agustian son of deceased son Richard. Three
