31 July 1909

Mrs. Duran Hamilton Dies.

Mrs. Duran Hamilton, until recently a resident of this city died Wednesday morning at 1:30 o'clock, at the Walla Walla hospital from the effects of an operation performed Tuesday for the removal of a cancer.

The deceased was born in Missouri July 18, 1861, being 48 years and nine days of age at the time of her demise. Besides a husband, she leaves seven children and a host of friends to mourn her loss.

The funeral services were held from the family residence in Waitsburg, Thursday afternoon, at two o'clock, Rev. W. H. Harris of Dayton, officiating. The remains were laid to rest in the Waitsburg city cemetery.

Divorce Cases.

The following divorce cases have been filed with County Clerk E. D. Cleveland:

Duran Hamilton vs. Nellie May Hamilton.

22 Sept 1915

The court has recently annulled the marriage contract entered into more than a year ago by Duran Hamilton of this city and Mrs. Nellie Sykes, of Montana. In divorce proceeding instituted by Mr. Hamilton, it was learned that Mrs. Sykes had been deserted by her former husband, but never freed by lawful proceedings, so a divorce in his case was unnecessary.

Duran Hamilton

Duran Hamilton, resident of Dayton at one time, died at the Colfax hospital Friday, after an illness of more than three years during which time he was almost constantly confined to his bed. Funeral services were held at Waitsburg Sunday. His daughter, Mrs. B. A. Whiting of this city, Mr. Whiting and Mr. and Mrs. H. P. Hansen were among the Dayton people who attended the services.

Mr. Hamilton was very active in the real estate business during his residence here, and at different times he owned numerous valuable properties among which were the present Rnnnewanz apartments on north Third street and the Dr. W. W. Day property on First street.

Besides his daughter, Mrs. B. A. Whiting of this city, Mr. Hamilton leaves four other daughters who live in Wenatchee, Spokane and Moscow and two sons of St. John and Moscow. He was about 76 years of age and had been a resident of the west since early life.
